Thirty-seven new cases and one death have been reported since yesterday's daily briefing was issued. There have been 5,952 laboratory-confirmed cases in Forsyth County. All cases reported by the Forsyth County Department of Public Health are Forsyth County residents. Of the 5,952, 5,241 are presumed recovered. The case count is subject to change throughout the day but will only be reported once per day in the daily briefing.



The Public Health Director will hold a Question & Answer session with the media at 4:30pm on August 27th. The call-in information was sent to the media yesterday.




