Forsyth County Government COVID-19 Daily Briefing November 9, 2020

Updated weekdays by approximately 12:30pm

There are 75 new cases reported today. Over the weekend, there were 136 new cases and one death reported on Saturday, and 157 new cases reported on Sunday. There have been 10,050 laboratory-confirmed cases in Forsyth County. All daily cases reported by the State are presumed Forsyth County residents but may later transfer to another county if the case is later identified as not residing in Forsyth County. Of the 10,050, 8,490 are presumed recovered. The case count is subject to change throughout the day but will only be reported once per day in the daily briefing.

The Public Health Director will provide a detailed briefing at 2:00pm at the beginning of the November 12th Board of County Commissioners meeting, which will be conducted remotely. Public Health Director Comment

Public Health Director Joshua Swift commented, "We continue to see community wide spread in Forsyth County. If you were or believe you are a close contact, quarantine and limit your exposure to others. If we all take reasonable steps we can limit the spread and slow down the virus."



- Saturday, Nov. 14, at Shiloh Baptist Church, 916 E. 12th Street, from 9 a.m.-12 p.m.




